

On March 11, 2016 the Versailles Police Department took multiple thefts complaints of cars being broke into in the village. It was also, learned that Darke County Sheriff's Department also had multiple car and business broken into in their jurisdiction.

On March 13, 2016 Chief Mark Humphreys of the Versailles Police Department along with Detective Rodney Baker of the Darke County Sheriff's Department started an investigation into these break-ins. During the investigation it was learned that the two individuals were from Mercer County Ohio. Surveillance was conducted with assistance from the Mercer County Sheriff's Department that led to arrest warrants being issued in Mercer County.

On April 28, 2016 the Darke County Grand Jury heard testimony that led to the indictment of the following two individuals Zachary Huff and Mason Self. The Darke County Grand handed down a 33 count indictment.

14 Counts of Petty Theft

11 Counts of Breaking & Entering

3 Counts of Criminal Damaging

5 Counts of Burglary.

These break-ins started back in February of 2016 through March 17, 2016 which included some in Ansonia, Ohio.
